More Information	My CD was released in 1995 by Trikont under the same title "Hain". "Hain" and also my other pieces about the Selk'nam Indians with the corresponding photos by Martin Gusinde and others were made accessible to the public and posterity. The Selk'nam should not be forgotten. "Hain" was presented during the "Sunwheel" project both in Lelystad on 7.8.1992 (2 pm) and in Massada on 25.9.1994, (7 am). Also the exhibition "Patagonie", which took place between the 6.3.2012 and 13.5.1012 in the Musée Du Quai Branly in Paris, was under this sign. My music "Hain" was played in the exhibition halls.
